


WHS should be a priority in any company. If a boss doesn't understand their work-safe responsibilities or implement WHS practices, fines over \$1.5 million or jail time can apply!

New SA Law Targeting Extreme Speed Offenders


South Australian police now have the power to immediately disqualify the licence of drivers who commit extreme speeding offences -55km/hr over the limit in a 60km/h zone (or less) or 80km/hr over limit in a 60km/h+ zone.

Offenders can be jailed up to three years and face a mandatory minimum disqualification for a first offence. subsequent offences, the licence disqualification period can be increased to five years.

Australia's Vehicle and Fuel Consumption Record Trumps Globe

The latest (2020) ABS survey of motor vehicle use, recorded that there are roughly 0.7 cars per person (PP) in Australia. That's:

- 25 million people
- 19./ million vehicles





76 billion kg of Co2 emissions.

Motorisation rates across the globe are significantly smaller, with 0.5 cars PP recorded in 2019 in the UK and 0.17 cars PP in 2018 in China.
