THIS MONTH: HEAVY VEHICLE AWARENESS

Trucks and buses are essential service providers in Australia, and we would grind to a halt without them. As road users, we share the space with them, yet many of us know little about heavy vehicles, and this can create an unsafe environment.

Some heavy vehicles can have significant blind spots, making it very difficult for their drivers to see other road users. In addition to that, given their size, it takes heavy vehicles much longer to slow-down and come to a complete stop than other vehicles and therefore they need a considerably larger safety gap. This is why sometimes when a car pulls in front of them on the road, you may notice the heavy vehicle change lanes. This is because the driver knows that the vehicle in front of them did not leave enough of a safety barrier.

So the next time you are sharing the road with a heavy vehicle, keep in mind that their needs are different to yours





NEWS UPDATE

Finland Speeding Driver Fined Almost \$200,000

A driver in Finland has been fined nearly \$200,000 AUD for exceeding the speed limit.

The driver was caught travelling at 82km/hr in a 50km/hrzone on the Åland Islands in the southwest of the country, resulting in a fine of 121,000 Euros (\$195,796 AUD) and a 10-day license suspension.

Comparatively, in NSW, if you were caught exceeding the speed limit by 32km/hr in a 50km/hr-zone, the fine would be \$2200 and a license disqualification of at least three months.

Many of our native wildlife are most active during dawn and dusk, which poses a higher risk while driving at these times. Kangaroos are the most dangerous due to their size and their seeming predilection to jumping in front of moving vehicles. Slowing down helps gives you more reaction time and reduces impact force in the event of a collision.
