THIS MONTH: Alternative Transport

This month, we focused on alternative transport and the dangers cyclists, pedestrians and the like face on shared roads. Referred to as vulnerable road users, those who choose to take alternative transport modes often have less protection than those who drive or travel in vehicles.

Research from the Australian Automobile Association highlights that in the 12 months to June 2024 alone, of the 1,310 fatalities on Australian roads, 12.6% were pedestrians, 21.1% were motorcyclists, and 2.6% were cyclists. This is equivalent to 165 pedestrian deaths, 277 motorcyclist deaths, and 34 cyclist deaths.

In terms of public transport, between 2016-2023, there was an average of 178 fatalities per year across the Australian heavy rail network. In the 12 months to September 2024, there were additionally 16 road deaths involving buses.

No matter how you travel or how frequently you use alternative transport methods, always remember the part you play in keeping yourselves and other road users safe. Whilst vulnerable road users have a responsibility to remain visible and follow the road rules, drivers too have the responsibility to remain alert and give way where necessary.

ROAD TIP OF THE MONTH

Having a little extra courtesy and kindness behind the wheel can be a helpful tool to reduce the risks of a collision.
